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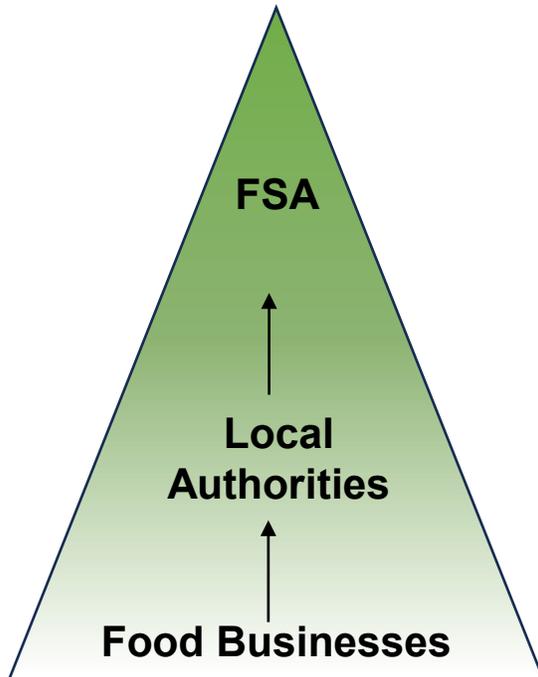

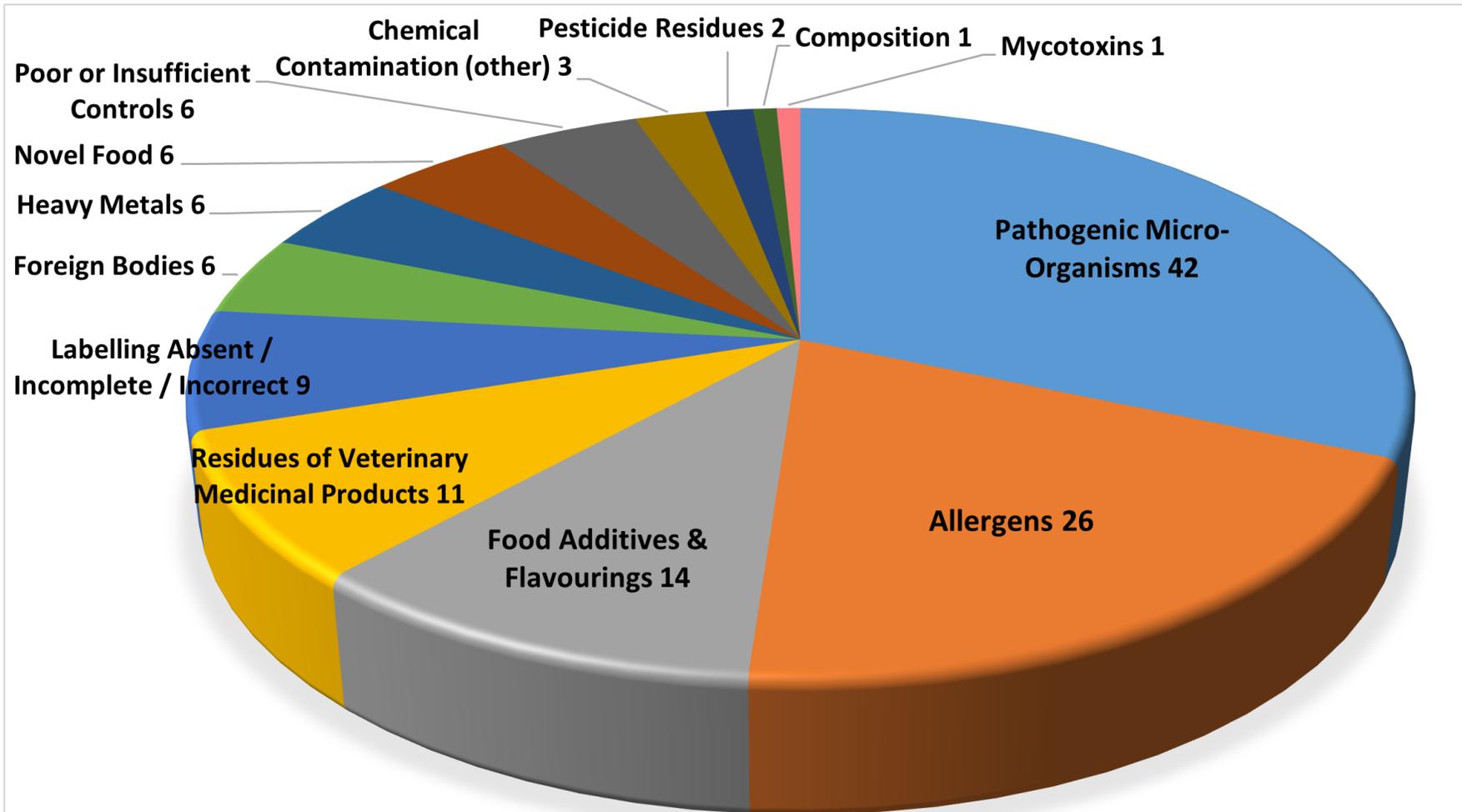


Our shared objectives

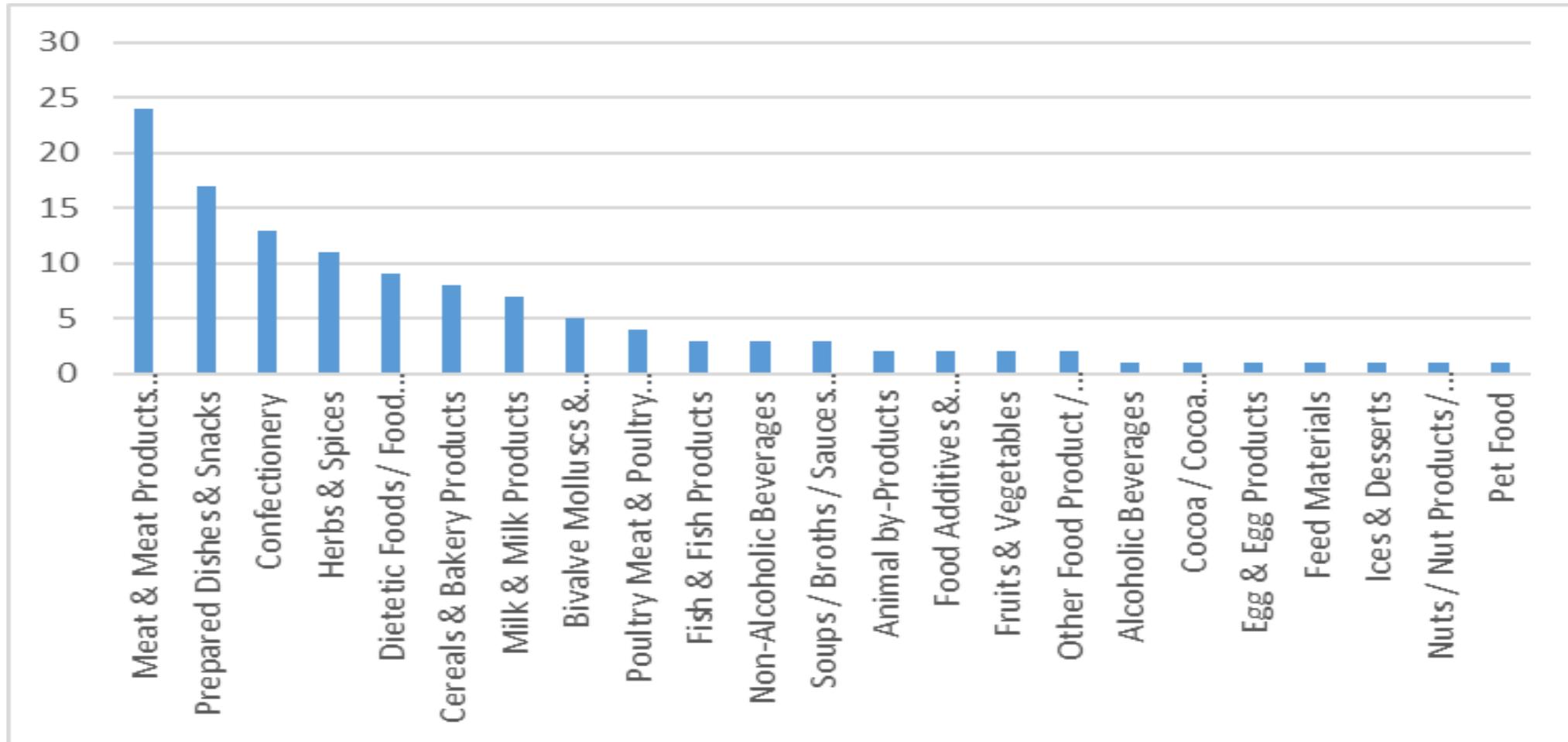
- **Food businesses** – around 35k registered in Wales
- **Local Authorities** – 22 LAs in Wales; 317 in England and 11 in Northern Ireland
- **Food Standards Agency** – 133 incidents managed in 24/25 for Wales

Incident Definition and Key Legislation

The Food Law Code of Practice (Wales) defines a food incident as:

“Any event where, based on the information available, there are concerns about actual or suspected threats to the safety, quality or integrity of food that could require intervention to protect consumers’ interests”.

The Feed Law Code of Practice (Wales) defines a feed incident as:

“Where there are concerns about actual or suspected threats to the safety or quality of feed that requires intervention to protect public health”.



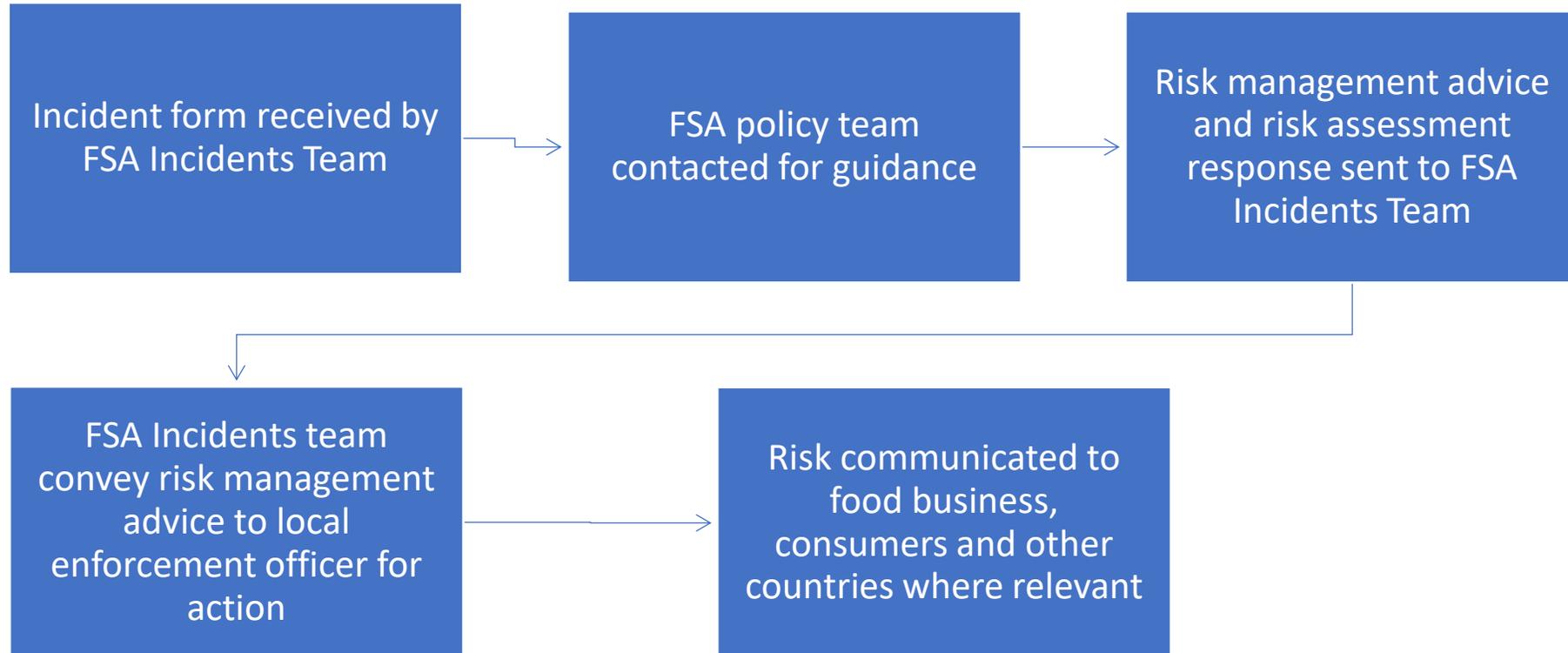

Signals and emerging issues

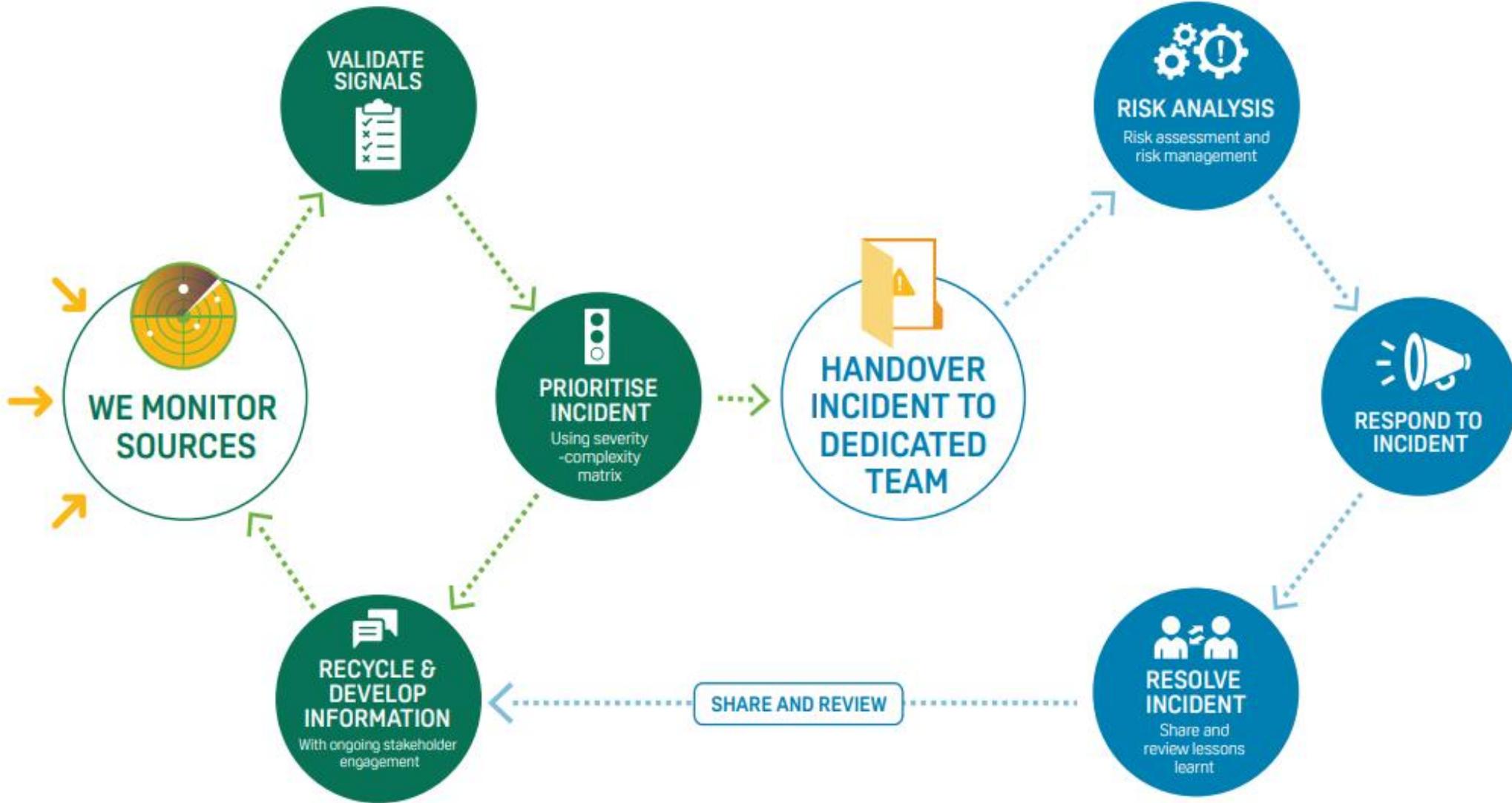
The work of the Signals Team provides an increased capability & capacity to detect, respond and prevent food and feed safety incidents occurring in the UK.

Established to mitigate the loss of full access to EU incidents systems, primarily RASFF

Actively monitor from over 50 open data sources that report on food and feed safety incidents which have occurred across the globe

Key focus is incident prevention – Building an understanding on what’s going on in the rest of the world by monitoring these sources to determine their immediate impact to the UK

Identify potential incident trends or emerging risks through the wider analysis of our data.



What is Root Cause Analysis?

Definition of Root Cause...

‘The underlying cause(s) of a problem which, if addressed, will prevent a recurrence of that problem’

RCA is a problem solving process to help identify the...

- chain of events leading up to an incident
- specific step(s) within that chain where action can be taken to prevent recurrence

It encourages the investigator to...

- look beyond the solution to the immediate problem
- understand the fundamental or underlying cause(s) of the situation
